As some students have said in the past, the answer for the inference type questions will not be "right in front of you" in the text. Making inferences is a skill that takes some investigating, questioning and thinking. A poet usually tries to say a great deal with little words. So, making inferences in poetry can sometimes be a difficult task.

Step-by-Step Guide to Drawing Inferences in Poetry ...

Blackout Poetry. This is an oldie, but goodie poetry writing exercise for high school students. Copy a page or two from a whole class novel. Or better yet, choose a completely divergent text, maybe a science textbook or page from a dictionary. Students string together words on the page to form a poem, and black-out the rest of the words.

Explain to students that when you make an inference, you are "reading between the lines." In order to make an inference, you pay close attention to the details in the poem to make a logical assumption. An inference is a logical judgment based on a writer's words as well as your own knowledge and experience.
